### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in McLean County received \$227,333 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 2 full-time staff and 2 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 25 children in Out of Home Care, 19 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$2,492.

16% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 84% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

McLean County received \$25,796 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 8 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 406 children a month, collecting \$820,767 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 8 orders.
