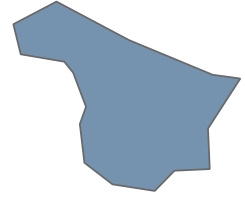

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 4 members in McLean County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$105,149 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 25 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 1,065 people a month in McLean County, stretching over 456 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$2,045,121

During fiscal year 2024, in McLean county there were 4 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 162 participants who received benefits totaling \$148,856.

## Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

McLean County received \$152,873 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 1,395, and 51% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$43,834. Additional grants totaled \$16,300.

McLean County received \$86,879 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 21 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 386 children, collecting \$786,450 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 349 orders.

There were 19 children cared for by foster families, 19 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$933.

10% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.  
89% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

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## Behavioral Health Services

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 2,716 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 7,944 of the 19,380 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 995 prescribers and 153 dispenser DEA numbers.

River Valley served 4,591 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.
