


Menifee County - Fiscal Year 2022

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Menifee County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$145,276 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 43 households in the past fiscal year.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Menifee County received \$175,593 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 2 full-time staff and 0 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 16 children in Out of Home Care, 16 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$944.

31% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 68% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Menifee County received \$27,141 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 7 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 391 children a month, collecting \$571,464 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 9 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 1,822 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 8,499 of the 16,650 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 799 prescribers and 155 dispenser DEA numbers.

Menifee County is served by the Pathways Community Mental Health Center. Pathways received \$7,060,661 in FY 2022.

Pathways served 11,751 individuals in their region.



Menifee is located in the Pathways Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$1,899,827 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.
