Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

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Health Services

Funding to Mercer County Health Department: \$793,951

During fiscal year 2024, in Mercer county there were 11 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 541 participants who received benefits totaling \$542,572.

There are 2 WIC-approved grocers in Mercer County.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Mercer County received \$373,808 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 3,212, and 57% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$468,597.

Additional grants totaled \$4,500.

Mercer County received \$1,198,756 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 296 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 961 children, collecting \$1,605,059 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 962 orders.

There were 20 children cared for by foster families, 18 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,716.

20% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 80% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 6,688 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 19,096 of the 46,507 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 2,186 prescribers and 313 dispenser DEA numbers.
