

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 0 members in Metcalfe County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$169,255 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 46 households in the past fiscal year.



On average, SNAP supported 2,049 people a month in Metcalfe County, stretching over 895 households.

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Health Services

Funding to Barren River District Health Department: \$8,006,577

During fiscal year 2024, in Metcalfe county there were 3 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 327 participants who received benefits totaling \$287,236.

There are 1 WIC-approved grocers in Metcalfe County.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Metcalfe County received \$190,827 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 1,447, and 68% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$45,812. Additional grants totaled \$750.

Metcalfe County received \$95,414 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 28 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 515 children, collecting \$760,513 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 480 orders.

There were 19 children cared for by foster families, 14 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,707.

36% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 63% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

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Behavioral Health Services

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 2,898 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 9,916 of the 22,087 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 981 prescribers and 163 dispenser DEA numbers.

Metcalfe County is served by the Lifeskills Community Mental Health Center. Lifeskills received \$9,957,965 in fiscal year 2024.

Lifeskills served 8,599 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.



Metcalfe is located in the Lifeskills region. This region received \$1,196,899 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.
