

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$364,703 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 109 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP serviced 3,956 people a month in Montgomery County, stretching over 1,943 households.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Montgomery County received \$706,762 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 6 full-time staff and 3 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 85 children in Out of Home Care, 79 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$5,377.

43% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 56% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

9 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Montgomery County received \$389,360 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 156 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 1,593 children a month, collecting \$2,708,641 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 50 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 8,639 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 35,890 of the 76,086 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 2,069 prescribers and 319 dispenser DEA numbers.

Montgomery County is served by the Pathways Community Mental Health Center. Pathways received \$7,060,661 in FY 2022.

Pathways served 11,751 individuals in their region.



Montgomery is located in the Pathways Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$1,899,827 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.

The Office of the Ombudsman and Administrative Review office had 274 constituent contacts in FY2022 in your county.

Office of Inspector General completed 25,705 background checks for children & elderly services throughout the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
