#### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Montgomery County received \$450,660 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$395,608. Additional grants totaled \$3,000. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Montgomery County received \$51,565 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 133 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,527 children, collecting \$2,485,592 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 1,475 orders.

There were 73 children cared for by foster families, 67 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$4,913.

13% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.86% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
