Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 0 members in Montgomery County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$454,900 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 120 households in the past fiscal year.

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Health Services

Funding to Montgomery County Health Department: \$3,742,913

During fiscal year 2024, in Montgomery county there were 10 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 1,030 participants who received benefits totaling \$915,825.

There are 3 WIC-approved grocers in Montgomery County.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Montgomery County received \$441,022 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 4,435, and 57% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$474,275. Additional grants totaled \$0.

Montgomery County received \$694,424 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 223 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,447 children, collecting \$2,536,841 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 1,417 orders.

There were 51 children cared for by foster families, 47 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$4,245.

15% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 84% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 9,198 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 34,098 of the 76,228 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 2,139 prescribers and 352 dispenser DEA numbers.

Montgomery County is served by the Pathways Community Mental Health Center. Pathways received \$7,882,552 in fiscal year 2024.

Pathways served 13,273 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.



Montgomery is located in the Pathways region. This region received \$2,007,623 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.

Public Protection Services

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 336 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2024 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 547 background checks for children & elderly services in Montgomery county fiscal year 2024.
