

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 2 members in Morgan County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$216,063 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 61 households in the past fiscal year.



On average, SNAP supported 2,348 people a month in Morgan County, stretching over 1,047 households.

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Health Services

Funding to Gateway District Health Department: \$5,034,696

During fiscal year 2024, in Morgan county there were 3 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 338 participants who received benefits totaling \$333,244.

There are 3 WIC-approved grocers in Morgan County.

Between the start of the HIV Epidemic (1982) and June 2024, there were 35 diagnosed cases of HIV in your county. (NOTE: 2023 and 2024 data is considered preliminary)

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Morgan County received \$246,802 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 1,685, and 74% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$100,485. Additional grants totaled \$0.

Morgan County received \$69,561 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 26 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 422 children, collecting \$567,532 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 389 orders.

There were 40 children cared for by foster families, 35 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$3,273.

2% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.

97% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 3,679 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 17,026 of the 32,923 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,282 prescribers and 226 dispenser DEA numbers.

Morgan is located in the Pathways region. This region received \$2,007,623 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 131 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2024 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 96 background checks for children & elderly services in Morgan county fiscal year 2024.
