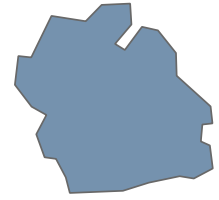

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Muhlenberg County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$376,003 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 128 households in the past fiscal year.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Muhlenberg County received \$550,221 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 8 full-time staff and 2 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 64 children in Out of Home Care, 58 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$4,076.

29% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption.
70% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Muhlenberg County received \$412,596 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 138 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 1,271 children a month, collecting \$2,250,171 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 94 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 9,165 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 36,944 of the 86,637 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.


Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,592 prescribers and 266 dispenser DEA numbers.

Muhlenberg County is served by the Pennyroyal Community Mental Health Center. Pennyroyal received \$5,713,393 in FY 2022.

Pennyroyal served 8,694 individuals in their region.
