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Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Muhlenberg County received \$550,221 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 8 full-time staff and 2 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 64 children in Out of Home Care, 58 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of 4,076.

29% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 70% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Muhlenberg County received \$412,596 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 138 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 1,271 children a month, collecting \$2,250,171 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 94 orders.
