

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 2 members in Nelson County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$231,157 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 94 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 3,708 people a month in Nelson County, stretching over 1,788 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$7,384,577

Kentucky Prescription Assistance Program (KPAP)

The KPAP helped 135 patients in Kentucky with 731 prescriptions to save a total of \$1,870,321 in prescription costs.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Nelson County received \$599,130 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$143,639. Additional grants totaled \$126,720. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Nelson County received \$45,090 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 101 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 2,282 children, collecting \$4,146,108 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 2,230 orders.

There were 28 children cared for by foster families, 25 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$2,279.

10% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 89% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 14,177 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 38,058 of the 94,544 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 3,485 prescribers and 444 dispenser DEA numbers.

Nelson County is served by the Communicare Community Mental Health Center. Communicare received \$7,971,462 in fiscal year 2023.

Communicare served 9,240 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2023.



Nelson is located in the Communicare region. This region received \$1,549,635 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2023.

Public Protection Services

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 383 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2023 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 50,778 background checks for children & elderly services across the Commonwealth of Kentucky in fiscal year 2023.
