Nicholas County received \$95,413 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 1,088, and 64% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$93,311. Additional grants totaled \$0.

Nicholas County received \$280,581 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 48 providers a year. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 398 children, collecting \$760,718 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 432 orders.

There were 7 children cared for by foster families, 7 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$775.

14% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 85% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
