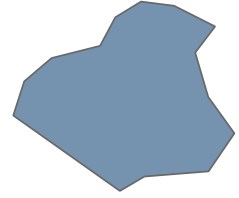

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 3 members in Oldham County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$122,069 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 41 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP serviced 1,334 people a month in Oldham County, stretching over 599 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in FY2022: \$3,555,343

## Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Oldham County received \$161,577 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 2 full-time staff and 0 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 48 children in Out of Home Care, 39 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$4,163.

52% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption.  
47% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

9 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Oldham County received \$570,463 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 150 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 1,063 children a month, collecting \$3,008,869 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 46 orders.

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 17,045 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 29,469 of the 103,684 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 3,612 prescribers and 428 dispenser DEA numbers.

### Syringe Services Programs

Oldham County is served by the Seven Counties Community Mental Health Center. Seven Counties received \$22,200,523 in FY 2022.

Seven Counties served 25,555 individuals in their region.



Oldham is located in the Seven Counties Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$5,335,241 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.

## Public Protection
