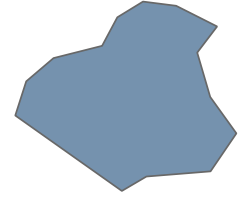

**AmeriCorps**  
Kentucky

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Oldham County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$161,320 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 46 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 1,525 people a month in Oldham County, stretching over 679 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$2,966,999

## Health Services

Funding to Oldham County Health Department:

During fiscal year 2024, in Oldham county there were 5 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 589 participants who received benefits totaling \$491,236.

There are 4 WIC-approved grocers in Oldham County.

## Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Oldham County received \$135,911 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 1,764, and 36% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$102,940. Additional grants totaled \$0.

Oldham County received \$1,470,173 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 310 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,020 children, collecting \$2,745,461 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 914 orders.

There were 21 children cared for by foster families, 19 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,518.

19% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.  
80% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 18,039 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 29,578 of the 107,442 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 3,749 prescribers and 474 dispenser DEA numbers.

Oldham County is served by the Seven Counties Community Mental Health Center. Seven Counties received \$22,899,517 in fiscal year 2024.

Seven Counties served 24,161 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.



Oldham is located in the Seven Counties region. This region received \$5,746,244 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.

## Public Protection Services

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 434 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2024 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 280 background checks for children & elderly services in Oldham county fiscal year 2024.
