#### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Owen County received \$349,576 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 2 full-time staff and 1 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 30 children in Out of Home Care, 27 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$2,520.

23% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 76% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

3 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Owen County received \$114,678 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 37 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 501 children a month, collecting \$651,130 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 27 orders.
