Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Owen County received \$186,690 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$42,104. Additional grants totaled \$10,000. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Owen County received \$18,230 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 32 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 459 children, collecting \$665,379 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 460 orders.

There were 30 children cared for by foster families, 27 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$2,029.

20% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 80% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
