Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$284,750 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 63 households in the past fiscal year.

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### **Health Services**

Funding to Kentucky River District Health Department: \$7,233,479

During fiscal year 2024, in Owsley county there were 0 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.

### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Owsley County received \$158,810 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 746, and 75% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$304,768. Additional grants totaled \$0.

Owsley County received \$48,565 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 13 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 219 children, collecting \$135,577 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 214 orders.

There were 0 children cared for by foster families, 0 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$0.

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 1,299 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 7,867 of the 15,983 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.
