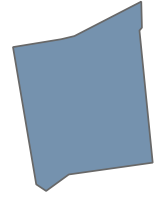

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 0 members in Pendleton County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$225,484 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 59 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 1,685 people a month in Pendleton County, stretching over 693 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$3,358,639

Funding to Three Rivers District Health Department:

During fiscal year 2024, in Pendleton county there were 12 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 269 participants who received benefits totaling \$255,158.

### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Pendleton County received \$190,827 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 2,214, and 57% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$56,444. Additional grants totaled \$14,938.

Pendleton County received \$813,775 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 151 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 758 children, collecting \$1,390,729 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 733 orders.

There were 23 children cared for by foster families, 17 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,305.

4% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 0 child(ren) adopted  
 95% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).



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## Behavioral Health Services

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 4,022 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 11,561 of the 27,204 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,576 prescribers and 208 dispenser DEA numbers.
