Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Perry County received \$800,928 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 11 full-time staff and 0 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 49 children in Out of Home Care, 43 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$2,795.

48% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 51% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Perry County received \$398,431 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 144 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 1,717 children a month, collecting \$2,175,988 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 74 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 8,841 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 55,843 of the 106,536 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,508 prescribers and 315 dispenser DEA numbers.
