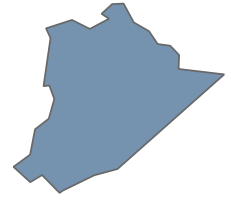

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 19 members in Pike County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$598,129 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 237 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 11,985 people a month in Pike County, stretching over 6,017 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$23,740,674

The KPAP helped 29 patients in Kentucky with 142 prescriptions to save a total of \$367,784 in prescription costs.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Pike County received \$1,207,080 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$1,000,536. Additional grants totaled \$2,500. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Pike County received \$66,839 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 186 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 2,764 children, collecting \$3,894,045 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 2,950 orders.

There were 128 children cared for by foster families, 119 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$7,502.

56% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.
43% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 17,858 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 94,759 of the 196,625 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 2,450 prescribers and 398 dispenser DEA numbers.
