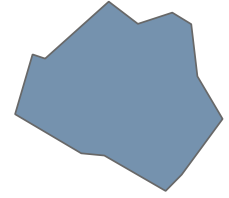

**AmeriCorps  
Kentucky**

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 2 members in Robertson County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$30,047 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 9 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 335 people a month in Robertson County, stretching over 143 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$614,503

### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Robertson County received \$55,860 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$0. Additional grants totaled \$0. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Robertson County received \$682 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 2 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 86 children, collecting \$70,231 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 67 orders.

There were 0 children cared for by foster families, 0 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$0.

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 616 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 1,883 of the 4,785 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.
