


## **Robertson County - Fiscal Year 2024**

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 0 members in Robertson County.

#### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$30,512 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 7 households in the past fiscal year.

#### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Robertson County received \$62,548 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 454, and 74% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$1,000.

Additional grants totaled \$1,000.

Robertson County received \$26,584 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 8 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 72 children, collecting \$87,778 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 65 orders.

There were 0 children cared for by foster families, 0 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$0.

0% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.

#### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 652 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 1,960 of the 4,920 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.
