

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 11 members in Rockcastle County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$226,859 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 75 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP serviced 318 people a month in Rockcastle County, stretching over 144 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in FY2022: \$842,520

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Rockcastle County received \$499,375 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 7 full-time staff and 0 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 37 children in Out of Home Care, 25 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$1,538.

24% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 75% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

5 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Rockcastle County received \$218,342 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 93 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 875 children a month, collecting \$1,443,742 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 37 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 4,986 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 20,986 of the 39,755 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,475 prescribers and 219 dispenser DEA numbers.

Rockcastle County is served by the Cumberland River Community Mental Health Center. Cumberland River received \$7,744,292 in FY 2022.

Cumberland River served 11,714 individuals in their region.



Rockcastle is located in the Cumberland River Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$2,496,403 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.
