Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 11 members in Rockcastle County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$268,178 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 76 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 3,437 people a month in Rockcastle County, stretching over 1,617 households.

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Health Services

Funding to Cumberland Valley District Health Department: \$2,837,854

During fiscal year 2024, in Rockcastle county there were 9 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 512 participants who received benefits totaling \$521,490.

There are 3 WIC-approved grocers in Rockcastle County.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Rockcastle County received \$360,875 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 2,801, and 65% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$249,593. Additional grants totaled \$0.

Rockcastle County received \$577,372 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 169 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 759 children, collecting \$1,228,732 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 807 orders.

There were 45 children cared for by foster families, 35 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$3,466.

28% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 71% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 5,169 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 19,644 of the 38,815 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,583 prescribers and 234 dispenser DEA numbers.
