Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 13 members in Rowan County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$335,464 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 103 households in the past fiscal year.

### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Rowan County received \$408,308 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 6 full-time staff and 1 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 57 children in Out of Home Care, 53 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$2,766.

22% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption.  
77% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

3 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Rowan County received \$551,154 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 187 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 1,124 children a month, collecting \$1,658,798 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 48 orders.

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 5,353 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 19,407 of the 40,627 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,627 prescribers and 317 dispenser DEA numbers.
