#### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Russell County received \$381,654 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 3,083, and 69% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$100,239. Additional grants totaled \$7,300.

Russell County received \$1,255,888 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 272 providers a year. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,147 children, collecting \$1,474,884 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 1,206 orders.

There were 60 children cared for by foster families, 29 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$2,511.

1% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 98% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
