Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 3 members in Scott County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$363,271 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 117 households in the past fiscal year.

### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Scott County received \$845,235 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 13 full-time staff and 5 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 74 children in Out of Home Care, 67 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$4,643.

43% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 56% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

21 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Scott County received \$1,075,866 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 283 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 2,139 children a month, collecting \$4,189,184 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 122 orders.

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 16,257 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 44,075 of the 107,009 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 3,132 prescribers and 467 dispenser DEA numbers.
