


Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$103,902 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 44 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 2,067 people a month in Simpson County, stretching over 911 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$3,922,046

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Simpson County received \$375,690 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$106,224. Additional grants totaled \$0. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Simpson County received \$33,050 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 73 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,149 children, collecting \$2,172,948 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 1,163 orders.

There were 37 children cared for by foster families, 28 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$2,500.

24% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 75% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 4,841 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analysesics accounted for 14,014 of the 31,646 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,386 prescribers and 177 dispenser DEA numbers.

Lifeskills served 8,568 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2023.



Simpson is located in the Lifeskills region. This region received \$1,112,084 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2023.
