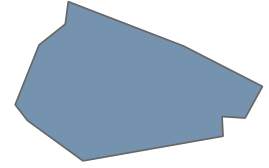

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 2 members in Spencer County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$121,271 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 32 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 964 people a month in Spencer County, stretching over 443 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$1,858,520

### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Spencer County received \$189,000 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$155,269. Additional grants totaled \$73,110. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Spencer County received \$39,522 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 71 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 483 children, collecting \$991,723 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 465 orders.

There were 9 children cared for by foster families, 6 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$239.

11% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.  
88% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 5,893 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 15,031 of the 39,662 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 2,487 prescribers and 312 dispenser DEA numbers.

Spencer County is served by the Seven Counties Community Mental Health Center. Seven Counties received \$21,081,935 in fiscal year 2023.

Seven Counties served 24,476 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2023.



Spencer is located in the Seven Counties region. This region received \$6,539,897 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2023.

## Public Protection Services

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 168 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2023 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 50,778 background checks for children & elderly services across the Commonwealth of Kentucky in fiscal year 2023.
