Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 3 members in Spencer County.

#### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$141,977 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 32 households in the past fiscal year.



On average, SNAP supported 985 people a month in Spencer County, stretching over 449 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$1,922,756

#### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Spencer County received \$190,827 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 3,353, and 37% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$168,083. Additional grants totaled \$28,110.

Spencer County received \$717,567 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 148 providers a year. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 445 children, collecting \$1,032,449 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 425 orders.

There were 15 children cared for by foster families, 15 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$2,036.


13% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 86% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
