

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Taylor County received \$470,354 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 7 full-time staff and 1 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 24 children in Out of Home Care, 22 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$1,739.

20% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 79% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

0 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Taylor County received \$884,281 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 228 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 1,486 children a month, collecting \$2,338,885 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 50 orders.
