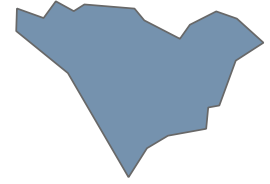

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 2 members in Taylor County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$619,442 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 162 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 4,250 people a month in Taylor County, stretching over 1,962 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$8,526,368

During fiscal year 2024, in Taylor county there were 6 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Taylor County received \$425,756 in funding for 2 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 4,082, and 59% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$242,989. Additional grants totaled \$5,000.

Taylor County received \$1,474,354 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 333 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,500 children, collecting \$2,263,987 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 1,461 orders.

There were 13 children cared for by foster families, 11 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,159.

23% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.
76% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 8,025 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 27,436 of the 66,543 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 2,058 prescribers and 309 dispenser DEA numbers.
