Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Todd County received \$189,000 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$31,400. Additional grants totaled \$2,000. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Todd County received \$20,244 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 42 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 563 children, collecting \$976,221 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 533 orders.

There were 20 children cared for by foster families, 13 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$500.

60% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 40% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
