Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

## Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Union County received \$323,927 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 5 full-time staff and 0 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 24 children in Out of Home Care, 20 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$1,528.

54% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 45% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Union County received \$270,734 from the Child Care
Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 91 providers
a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 1,090 children a month, collecting \$2,032,685 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 51 orders.

## Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 3,730 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 10,996 of the 28,884 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,026 prescribers and 142 dispenser DEA numbers.

Union County is served by the River Valley Community Mental Health Center. River Valley received \$6,160,914 in FY 2022.

River Valley served 5,649 individuals in their region.



Union is located in the River Valley Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$1,027,344 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.

Office of Inspector General completed 25,705 background checks for children & elderly services throughout the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
