AmeriCorps Kentucky

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

#### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$890,152 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 405 households in the past fiscal year.

### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Warren County received \$2,059,050 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$804,707. Additional grants totaled \$260,210. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Warren County received \$235,950 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 497 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 5,396 children, collecting \$9,364,449 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 4,965 orders.

There were 369 children cared for by foster families, 287 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$27,609.

32% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 67% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
