

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Webster County received \$431,941 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 3 full-time staff and 0 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 10 children in Out of Home Care, 6 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of 343.

40% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 60% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Webster County received \$47,640 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 18 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 639 children a month, collecting \$1,509,023 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 26 orders.
