Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 2 members in Woodford County.

#### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$119,888 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 43 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 1,751 people a month in Woodford County, stretching over 791 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$3,525,058

## Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Woodford County received \$371,070 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$193,235. Additional grants totaled \$0. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Woodford County received \$66,069 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 99 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 688 children, collecting \$1,573,611 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 659 orders.

There were 21 children cared for by foster families, 18 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,433.

57% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 42% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

According to KASPER data, 7,575 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analysesics accounted for 18,717 of the 50,180 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.
