Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Woodford County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$160,670 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 51 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 1,688 people a month in Woodford County, stretching over 806 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$3,482,829

## Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Woodford County received \$360,875 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 4,036, and 41% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$284,157. Additional grants totaled \$0.

Woodford County received \$1,068,851 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 218 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 673 children, collecting \$1,509,975 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 621 orders.

There were 15 children cared for by foster families, 14 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,173.

46% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.  
53% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

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## Behavioral Health Services

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 7,823 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 18,393 of the 50,265 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 2,499 prescribers and 342 dispenser DEA numbers.
