TYPES OF CHILD CARE

- **Certified Family Child Care:** The caregiver can look after up to 10 children at their own home. This includes up to 6 children who are not related to them and up to 4 children who are related to them.
- **Type I:** A licensed type I child care facility is a place that takes care of children regularly. It can be in a non-residential setting (like a separate building) with 4 or more children, or in a residential setting (like a home) with 13 or more children.
- **Type II:** A licensed type II child care facility is a place where child care is regularly given to between 7 and 12 children. This can include up to 12 children who are related to the person running the facility.
- Nonregulated Child Care: The Division of Regulated Child Care doesn't oversee providers who care for three or fewer children who aren't related to them. If a provider looks after more than three unrelated children, they need to be certified or licensed unless they fall into an exempt category. You can find all the exempt categories in 922 KAR 2:090.


